



Recent Interesting Bird Sightings at DeBoville Slough



Birding at DeBoville Slough is a year round experience. Birds change from season to season, from migration to nesting to overwintering. Below is a list of birds seen in January at DeBoville Slough.

Canada Goose, Mute Swan, Mallard, Green-winged Teal, Bufflehead, Common Goldeneye, Hooded Merganser, Great Blue Heron, Northern Harrier, Cooper's Hawk, Bald Eagle, Glaucous-winged Gull, Anna's Hummingbird, Northern Flicker, Steller's Jay, Northwestern Crow, Common Raven, Black-capped Chickadee, Pacific Wren, American Dipper, American Robin, Fox Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Song Sparrow, Spotted Towhee, Common Merganser, Trumpeter Swan, Gadwall, American Wigeon, Red-tailed Hawk, Merlin, Downy Woodpecker, Belted Kingfisher, Peregrine Falcon, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Ruby-crowned Kinglet and Varied Thrush.

You might also see *Wood Ducks, Golden-crowned Kinglets, Pied-billed Grebe, Varied Thrush, Purple Finches or a Pileated Woodpecker* in February.
